"Local resident" here, pleased I was able to help a little. Have since realised that 1931 census is not available, perhaps the Electoral Roll would be....have since bumped into a lady in her eighties who

was born at "The Court" on the flat at the bottom of Bowl Hill. No. 5 Bowl Hill is where the little shop used to be. The nearest place to "Google" is a cottage called "KYNNESBY" Bowl Hill. Kingscourt.

Rodborough, GL5 5 DR. "The Court" was situated to the right side of it, not a very good picture as camera

didn't appear to go along past it..

Regret I didn't recognise any of the names on the chart. The family I am acquainted with ran a

sheet metal company, Robert Perry & Sons, which we think was in Dudbridge down in the valley

about a mile away. One of the sons lived in Kingscourt 40s/50s. probably in red brick house called

"Rosetree Villa", The Street, in Kingscourt, with a bit of land attached. I am not aware of this couple

having any children but not sure. The other brother was called Robert (so was his son who emigrated to

Canada probably in 1960s) also two daughters, no response to enquiry I made through mutual friend.

There are 83 Perrys in local phone book, 20 or so in Stroud area, none of them known to us .
